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MEETING MINUTES

Tuesday, November 7, 2024, 7:00 P.M. Town Board Meeting

1. CALL TO ORDER, ROLL CALL, PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE Chairman Laufenberg called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Roll call shows Chairperson Dave Laufenberg and Supervisors Dan Dresen, Matt Wright, and Leon Zinck III present; Supervisor Art Meinholz was excused.

Also present were Clerk-Treasurer Dianah Fayas, Road Patrolman Darin Ripp, Chuck Schaeffer, Chris Schaeffer, Mike Robinson, and Becky Lindeman.

Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

- CONFIRMATION OF COMPLIANCE WITH OPEN MEETINGS LAW
 The Clerk confirmed that the agenda was posted at town hall and on the Town website.
- 3. INFORMAL PUBLIC COMMENT TIME None.
- MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: October 15th & October 29th Budget Workshop
 Motion by Sup. Dresen, seconded by Sup. Wright to approve both meeting minutes. Motion carried, 4-0.
- 5. DRIVEWAY PERMIT APPLICATIONS: ROBINSON BROTHERS ENVIRONMENTAL (2)

 Motion by Sup. Dresen, seconded by Sup. Zinck to grant Robinson Brothers Environmental the driveway permits as shown on the plan. Motion carried, 4-0.
- 6. ACKER LIVING TRUST HIGHWAY 19 PLAT UPDATE & REQUEST FOR LETTER OF SUPPORT FOR DOT Supervisors reviewed a draft letter of support to the Department of Transportation for a 21-lot plat with an outlet to Highway 19 across from Kingsley Road and a turnaround and easement to both the east and west of the plat for future road connectivity and potential outlets. Supervisors would like the final paragraph's statement of support amended to read, "The Town is in support of the development of the site; it is consistent with the Town's Future Land Use plan."

Motion by Sup. Wright, seconded by Sup. Zinck to edit the draft letter as discussed and authorize chairman to sign it for the Ackers' submission to DOT. Motion carried, 4-0.

7. SECURITY SYSTEM UPDATE

Motion by Sup. Dresen, seconded by Sup. Wright to purchase the new camera system quoted from Mad City Tech with money to come from the General Fund fund balance. Motion carried, 4-0.

8. LOAN RENEWAL AND SIGNATORIES FOR 2020 ENCHANTED VALLEY ROAD LOAN

Motion by Sup. Wright, seconded by Sup. Dresen to renew the loan with a 90-day extension, authorizing the Town Clerk-Treasurer and Town Chairman to sign for. Motion carried, 4-0.

9. COUNTY INCREASE IN 2025 DOG LICENSE FEES

The County has increased their dog license fees; if the Town does not raise the amount collected by the same amount, the Town will lose money issuing dog licenses. The requested increase is solely for the County's portion of the fee; there is no increase to the Town's portion of the fee.

Motion by Sup. Wright, seconded by Sup. Zinck to approve a corresponding, like increase in the dog license fee. Motion carried, 4-0.

10. WAUNAKEE FIRE OPERATING AGREEMENT RE-WRITE DRAFT

Waunakee wants to start implementing recommendations of the report they commissioned; it's unclear how that can move forward with current operating agreement structure and resistance from some District members.

Motion by Chairman Laufenberg, seconded by Sup. Dresen to approve the Proclamation for Jerry Derr. Motion carried, 4-0.

12. OLD BUSINESS

a. IGA RENEWAL DISCUSSIONS WITH CITY OF MIDDLETON AND VILLAGE OF WAUNAKEE The Town will try and schedule a meeting with the Village before a regular town board meeting here at town hall.

b. BLIGHT, 7166 COUNTY HWY. K

Staff is working with GEC, our local Dane County Sheriff Deputy, property owner Howard Wagner, and town counsel to schedule an inspection of the interior of the home.

c. 2025 ROAD PROJECTS AND BID REQUESTS

Patrolman Ripp will put together a proposed project list based on proposed 2025 budget.

d. TRAFFIC CONTROL OPTIONS FOR GREENBRIAR AND HIGH ROADS

Because there is a lack of crash data to support permanent installation of a stop sign, the City of Middleton is not in favor of pursuing any traffic control measures in that area and a full traffic study is needed per DOT standards.

road specifications with a turn around when the road is reconstructed; property owners do not want to provide the land needed for a turn around to be installed.
